North America Outdoor Institute Recognized for Safety Education Programs

The North America Outdoor Institute received the Alaska Governor's Special Achievement Award in the field of Health and Safety during the 2010 Governor's Safety and Health Conference held at the Captain Cook Hotel in Anchorage. NAOI reached more than 10,000 individuals in the past year with Be Snow and Summer Smart education programs.

NAOI is a non-profit corporation founded in 2004 by a group of outdoor enthusiasts with a mission to save lives from preventable outdoor injuries and deaths using interactive, practical training methods.
